### 1. IUPsyS 2012 Assembly votes in President, Vice-President and Executive Committee members

The new IUPsyS President is Saths Cooper (South Africa) and the new of Vice-President is Tor Levin Hofgaard (Norway). The previous President, Rainer K Silbereisen, will continue to serve as an Officer in the role of Past-President. ICP2012 was held in Cape Town, South Africa, 22-27 July 2012. The Congress attracted around 6000 delegates from 103 countries, and included 133 invited addresses from all parts of the World.
